We collect or use the following information to For research purposes:

- Attendance and reason for absence data
- Exam results and qualifications
- Progress reports
- Data regarding de-registration from school rolls to elective home education

Lawful bases and data protection rights

Under UK data protection law, we must have a "lawful basis" for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO's website.

Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are in brief set out below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO's website:

- Your right of access You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for. You can read more about this right here.
- Your right to rectification You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete. <u>You can read more about this right here</u>.

Our lawful bases for the collection and use of your data

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information for **dealing with queries**, **complaints or claims** are:

- When we receive queries about the appropriateness of flexischooling for a specific educational setting or individual, we require a considerable level of detail on the circumstances in order to formulate a meaningful response to benefit the enquirer.

 - When we highlight successful examples of flexischooling, on our website or in promotional material, we seek the express permission of relevant individuals in order to do so.

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information For research purposes are:

- Contract we have to collect or use the information so we can enter into or carry out a contract with you. All of your data protection rights may apply except the right to object.
- Legitimate interests we're collecting or using your information because it benefits you, our organisation or someone else, without causing an undue risk of harm to anyone. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to portability. Our legitimate interests are:
 - Our consultancy offering for educational settings includes a \'Discover\'
 element, requiring extensive research on current challenges. In order to
 feedback on flexischooling\'s appropriateness for each setting, we need
 access to a range of relating to individuals and schools.

Where we get personal information from

- Directly from you

How long we keep information

Personal data shall be: (e) kept in a form which permits identification of data subjects for no longer than is necessary for the purposes for which the personal data are processed; personal data may be stored for longer periods insofar as the personal data will be processed solely for archiving purposes in the public interest, scientific or historical research purposes or statistical purposes in accordance with Article 89(1) subject to implementation of the appropriate technical and organisational measures required by this Regulation in order to safeguard the rights and freedoms of the data subject ('storage limitation')

Others we share personal information with

- Local authorities
- Specialist teachers such as peripatetic workers or speech and language therapists
- School governing bodies (such as Board of governors or Parent/teacher associations (PTA))
- Organisations we need to share information with for safeguarding reasons

- Legal bodies or authorities
- Relevant regulatory authorities
- External auditors or inspectors
- Organisations we're legally obliged to share personal information with
- Publicly on our website, social media or other marketing and information media
